

Orfelia ignobilis (Williston) 1896:257. (*Platyura*). St. Vincent, Panama to Brazil and Argentina.

Placoceratias longimanus (Williston) 1896:258. (*Ceroplatus*). St. Vincent, Trinidad, Panama, Peru.

Proceroplatus pictipennis (Williston) 1896:257. (*Platyura*). St. Vincent, Trinidad.

Leptogastridae

Longlegged Robber Flies
(Martin, 1968; Williston, 1896)

This family was formerly in the Asilidae, but was listed in the catalogue as a separate family. Most authors now consider them Asilidae (Steyskal, pers. com).

Leptogaster roederi Williston 1896:304. St. Vincent.

Lygistorrhinidae

(Papavero, 1977)

Probolaeus singularis Williston 1896:261. St. Vincent. The type of the genus, with 7 Neotropical species.

Micropezidae

Stilt-legged Flies
(Steyskal, 1968c)

Grallipeza mellea (Williston) 1896:373. (*Calobata*). St. Vincent.

Taeniptera tibialis (Macquart) 1843:404. Grenada, Guyana, Honduras, Trinidad south to Paraguay and Bolivia.

(= *dilator* Cresson 1926:274. Grenada).

Milichiidae

(Sabrosky, 1973; Williston, 1896)

Dermometopa tarsalis Loew 1866:184. St. Vincent, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Costa Rica, Mexico, Dominica.

(= *Platophrymyia nigra* Williston 1896:426).

Milichiella lacteipennis (Loew) 1866:185. Grenada, Cuba, Brazil, Chile, Costa Rica, Dominica, Hispaniola, Jamaica, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Peru, Puerto Rico, St. Vincent, Venezuela, Virgin Island.

Neophyllomyza magnipalpis (Williston) 1896:443. (*Phyllomyza*). St. Vincent.

Paramyiz nigra Williston 1897:2. Grenada (?= *nitens* (Loew)).

Pholeomyiz leucogastra (Loew) 1861:43. St. Vincent, Cuba, Mexico.

Stomosis innominata (Williston) 1896:443. (*Agromyza*). St. Vincent, Colombia, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Honduras, Mexico, Panama, Trinidad, Arizona.

Muscidae

House Flies and relatives

(Pont, 1972; Williston 1896:366-371).

The house fly family contains many dull-colored similar appearing species which are usually quite common. The stable fly, and other species in South America, are fierce biters and affect tourists on the beaches. Most larvae are coprophagous, sarcophagous, and saprophagous often in decaying materials. They are nature's decomposers and recyclers. In Grenada, 5 species are reported, 2 are cosmopolitan, with an additional 9 species listed for St. Vincent.

(=*bistriata* Wulp 1896:343. (*Coenosia*). Mexico).

(=*vittifera* Stein 1904:487. (*Coenosia*). Peru).

Cordiluroides flavipes (Williston) 1896:370. (*Coenosia*). St. Vincent, Jamaica, P. Rico.

Cyrtoneurina gemina (Wiedemann) 1830:436. (*Anthomyia*). Grenada, C. A., S. A.

Cyrtoneurina rescita (Walker) 1861:315. (*Aricia*). Mexico, St. Vincent, Cuba, Trinidad, Central and So. America to Bolivia-Paraguay.

(=*frontina* Wulp 1896:306. (*Clinopera*). Mexico).

(=*maculipennis* Williston 1896:368. (*Cyrtoneura*). St. Vincent).

(=*pterostigma* Wulp 1896:309. (*Clinopera*). Mexico).

(=*setinervis* Thompson 1869:549. (*Anthomyia*). Ecuador).

Fannia exilis (Williston) 1896:369. (*Limnophora*). St. Vincent.

Gymnodia debilis (Williston) 1896:369. (*Limnophora*). St. Vincent, Mexico, Jamaica, Puerto Rico, Venezuela, U.S.A.

Limnophora exul Williston 1896:370. St. Vincent, Cuba, Jamaica.

Musca domestica Linnaeus 1758:596. Listed as cosmopolitan; Grenada.

Ophyra aenescens (Wiedemann) 1830:435. (*Anthomyia*). West Indies: Bermuda, St. Vincent, Puerto Rico, Jamaica, Trinidad, N. A., Eur., Pacific.

Stomoxys calcitrans (Linnaeus) 1758:604. (*Conops*). Cosmopolitan; W. I.: Grenada, St. Vincent, Bahamas, Jamaica, Barbados, Puerto Rico, Dominica, Haiti.

(=*geniculata* Macquart 1846:320. Brazil).
